Ontario will honour the memory of Dr. Frank William Schofield and his dedication to the people of Korea through the Dr. Schofield Statue and Memorial Gardens.

The province will provide \$400,000 toward the completion of this symbolic memorial in the heart of the Toronto Zoo.

Dr. Schofield was a prolific Ontarian, who was actively involved in Korea's March 1 Independence Movement in 1919. He served as a missionary in Korea from 1916 to 1920.

The new gardens will enhance the Toronto Zoo, already well known as a local tourist destination and contributor to Ontario's economy. Investments in tourism and culture are part of the <u>Open Ontario plan</u> to create a stronger and more competitive tourism industry.
